The foundation of this role lies in a deep understanding of Islamic teachings, effective teaching skills, and dedication to forming a generation of responsibility and integrity. Teachers have complex and varied tasks in Islamic education, from transmitting religious knowledge to guiding students in the development of character and moral skills. In addition, they are also responsible for creating an inclusive and supportive learning environment, where every student feels valued and supported. Teachers in Islamic education face a number of complex challenges, including social and cultural complexity, technological developments, and teacher quality and professionalism. These challenges require a holistic and sustainable approach to address, with a focus on developing the skills, knowledge and support necessary for teachers to be effective in their role.

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
